Students gain real-world experience

TAFE Queensland Gold Coast students studying Screen and Media, Technical Production and Beauty are getting their first real world experience as they take part in the filming and production of Humaneity TV. Humaneity is a Gold Coast not-for-profit organisation bringing together students, teachers, parents, businesses, community groups and individuals to work collaboratively on designing and implementing innovative and sustainable living.

Next Wednesday(19 April), the students will host a live TV show at their Coomera campus at called Sustainable Living and Tiny Houses.
